Clothing and Winter Attire

With the cold weather upon us, we would like to remind families and students of the importance of dressing appropriately for the weather including hats, mittens, and snowpants

(extra mitts are always a good idea too in the event of mittens getting lost or wet). As the weather changes we ask that all students pack a change of clothes in the event that their clothing gets wet or dirty/muddy while going outside during recess or lunch.

Important weather reminders

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather.

It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or
- All schools are open, but some or all buses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- Bused students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and
- Non-bused students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

Talk with your child about their books. Ask questions about the story and encourage your child to ask their own questions.




Make reading aloud a regular part of your **routine** — just 15 minutes each day can make a big difference in raising a reader.

What does it mean to be fluent with math facts?

Information for families and caregivers



DID YOU KNOW? Children are fluent when they demonstrate:

Accuracy

- Correctly solving a problem Flexibility
- The ability to think about a problem in more than one way and to adapt or adjust thinking as necessary

Efficiency

 Solving a problem in a reasonable amount of time



MYTH: Math today is so different

FACT: While the math itself hasn't changed, the focus of math instruction has shifted to ensure students are actively engaged in developing an understanding of the skills and concepts. Representing concepts using models to develop strategies and exercising critical thinking is a much more effective way to build understanding.



MYTH: Memorization is the best way to master basic facts.

FACT: Children may have memorized basic facts, however, they may not have a strategy to solve the particular fact. Memorized facts can be forgotten, but when a strategy is understood, children hang on to it forever.



MYTH: Children who have memorized the facts won't be challenged.

FACT: The goal is not to memorize facts, but to develop a range of strategies to apply to more complex concepts such as multi-digit computations, decimals and fractions. Developing strategies and an understanding of when to use these appropriately, asks children to think at higher levels.

MYTH: Timed tests help children master facts.

FACT: Timed tests do not assess fluency, only accuracy and efficiency. As well, research tells us that timed tests can lead to the development of anxiety around mathematics.

Questions to support fact fluency conversations with children

- · How did you solve it?
- · How do you know it is correct?
- · Is there another way you could solve it?
- If someone didn't know the answer to ____, how would you help them to figure it out?
- · What strategy can you use to find that fact?
- How is ____ like ____? How are they different? (example: How is 2 x 7 like 4 x 7?)

Reminders

- Please, do not send **nut or peanut products** to school (this includes Nutella products).
- Our school is a scent-free zone! We ask that all parents, guardians, and visitors refrain
 from using scented products such as perfumes, colognes, and heavily scented lotions
 when on at school. Many of our students and staff members have sensitivities or
 allergies to certain scents. Your cooperation and understanding in this matter are
 greatly appreciated.
- It is helpful to have a complete **change of clothes** in your child's backpack just in case of mud, puddles, or spills and it may save you a trip in the middle of your day.
- Please do not bring **dogs** onto school grounds. If you do bring your dog, please stay on the sidewalk and not on school property.
- Please ensure that your child has **indoor shoes** for school and wears outdoor shoes/boots to help keep our school clean.
- Students are not permitted to use cell phones during the school day. If students bring cellphones to school, they must be turned off and in their backpacks for the entire school day.
