Four of our Grade 6 students were speakers, sharing powerful messages and helping us all understand why we recognize this significant part of our history. Students from grade 6 Ryan and grade 2 Bambury/McLeod sang Blackbird in the Mi'kmaw language and the whole school sang the Honor Song.

We were also honoured to welcome Brittany Pennell, Regional Coordinator of Mi'kmaw Education & Services for HRCE. She shared the Mi'kmaw Gathering Song and played her drum, making the experience even more meaningful for our students and staff.

We look forward to a year of continued learning, growth, and community.

It is not meant to be used for student assessment, just practice. 


