

The team from the Mi'kmawey Debert Cultural Centre, led by celebrated Mi'kmaw artist and storyteller, Gerald Gloade, anticipate this year's poster will help audiences better understand and celebrate this artform that was preserved and passed down by our ancestors for many generations.


Reminders
